Summary of Performance



Portfolio for all students who receive special education services beginning with 2023 graduates



Benefits of portfolio



Summary of Performance



- For students who have IEPs exiting school with a diploma or a Certificate of Completion (COC) or for students who have aged out of special education services.
- The transition portfolio will take the place of the Summary of Performance.
- All students who have an IEP will be expected to have a transition portfolio, beginning with the 2023 cohort.

Before We Get Started



- Updated FAQ document
- The portfolio is part of the transition plan.
- A student's portfolio link may be added to the narrative sections of the IEP.
- The IEP and the portfolio are stand-alone documents.
- Non-COC students should use Indiana Career Explorer.



Benefits



- Advanced starting point upon exiting school
- Provides immediate indication of career path/interest
- Provides rapid discovery of:
 - Support needs, preferences, interests, and communication style
 - Work experiences, employability skills, and ideal work conditions
 - Provides underlayment for postsecondary goal attainment
- Pre-ETS effectiveness increased

Google Sites

Use Google Sites Template when:

- Student is not earning a diploma.
- Student is not accessing mostly General Education classes.
- Student requires extensive modifications even for simple tasks.




Indiana Career Explorer

Use Indiana Career Explorer (or another approved program) when:


- Student is earning a diploma.
- Student is not earning a diploma but accesses mostly General Education classes.
- Student is not earning a diploma and does not access mostly General Education classes, BUT the student does not require extensive modifications for even simple tasks.
- Refer to the Transition Portfolio Guidance document for determining which transition portfolio platform to select.

Decisional Flowchart










Helpful Information: Timeline

8th and 9th Grade

- Student Demographics and Learning Characteristics are the focus.
- Depending on the student, you might begin Academic Skills and Employability Skills sections.





Helpful Information: Timeline, cont.

10th Grade

- Focus on Academic Skills and make changes/additions to the Learning Characteristics section to reflect student growth and emerging challenges.
- Focus on Employability Skills can begin, depending upon the student.

Helpful Information: Timeline, cont. 2

11th Grade

- Continue focus on Academic Skills and make updates to both Learning Characteristics and Employability Skills sections, as necessary.
- Student experiences will vary greatly, so too will content for each student and at varying times.

Helpful Information: Timeline, cont. 3

12th Grade and Beyond

- Make your focus the Employability Skills section.
- As in previous years, update information in other sections, as necessary.

12th & Beyond



Helpful Reminders

- The portfolio will evolve it is a living document.
- Include meaningful and ample artifacts in the portfolio sections.
- This is a high stakes document for many students.
