Q. Do I need to keep a running list of transition assessments, or may I wipe them out each year?

• That is a district/cooperative decision. The Indiana IEP system allows you to keep a running list of assessments that have been given.

Q. Do you need to complete a new transition assessment on a move-in, or may you continue with the one from previous school?

- If the transition assessments that a student enters your school with are current (within the last IEP year) you can use those to inform your decision making.
- If a student comes to you with either no assessments, or there are no current assessments, you must initiate or update.

Q. Can a transition service/activity cover (support) more than one postsecondary goal area?

• Yes, though there must be a connection to how it supports that postsecondary area.

Q. Can a specific course serve as a transition service/activity?

- Yes, if the class supports the student's specific postsecondary goals (for example: the student wants a career in culinary arts and takes a foods class).
- Use the narrative to make the connection between the class and the student's postsecondary goals

Q. If a teacher has an authentic assessment tool that is working well, how does he go about sharing that with others?

Q. When will the Certificate of Completion plans be finalized?

• There is a state-wide workgroup currently working on guidance for the Certificate of Completion. No launch date has been released at this time.

Q. Is there a legal definition for "competitive employment"?

• **Competitive** integrated **employment** (CIE): full- or part-time work at minimum wage or higher, with wages and benefits similar to those without disabilities performing the same work, and fully integrated with coworkers without disabilities. (WIOA, 2016)

Q. Is there any data that supports sheltered workshops? If so, who is collecting that data?

 According to the 2001 investigation by the Government Accountability Office into the 14(c) program, only approximately 5% of sheltered workshop employees left to take a job in the community. Sheltered workshops are ineffective at transitioning individuals with disabilities to integrated employment. (National Council on Disability, 2012).
